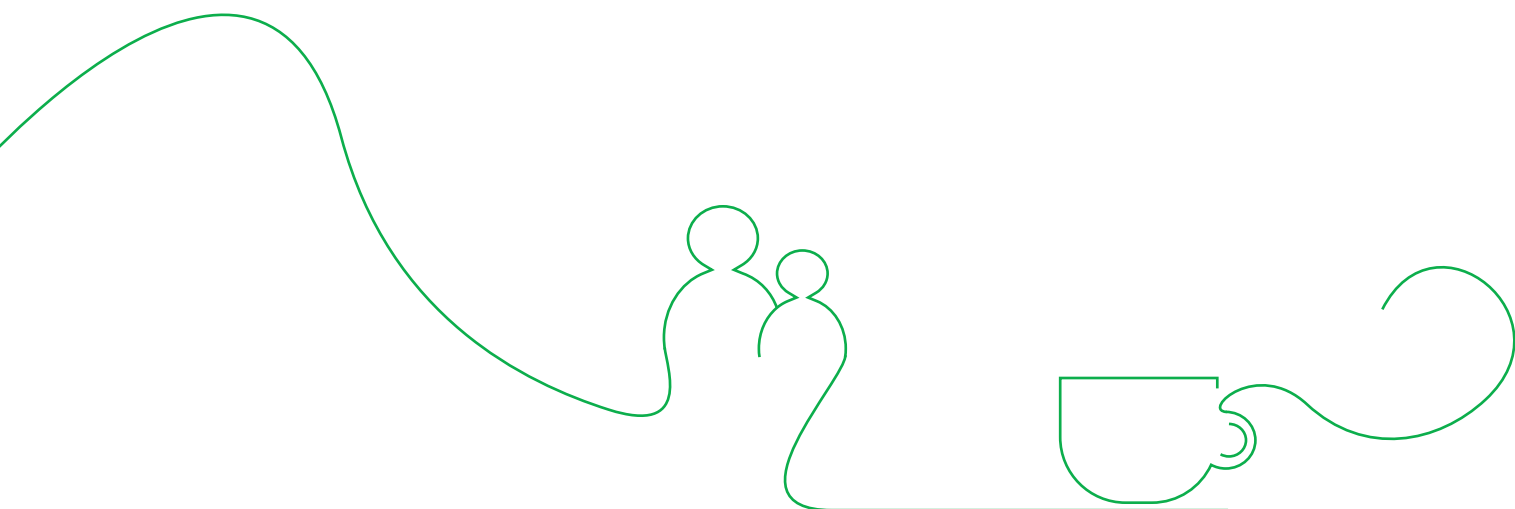

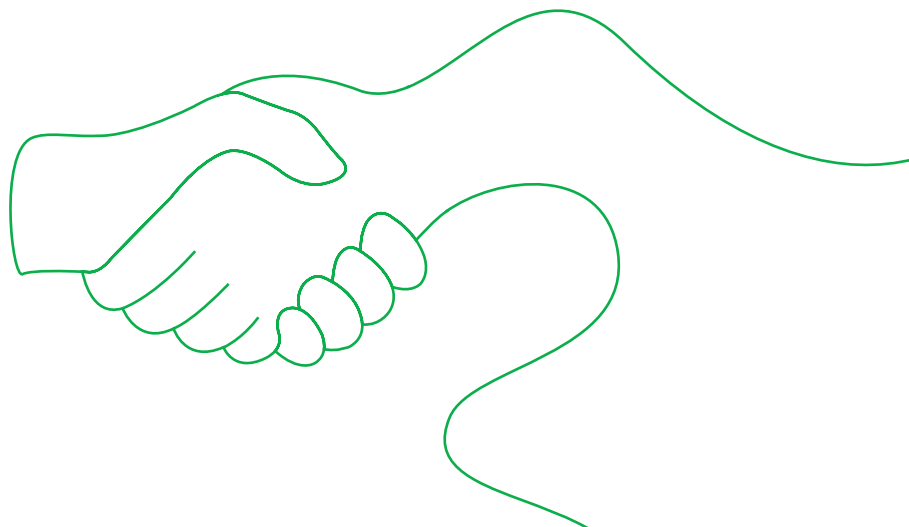
The Sustainability in Crop Production Stakeholder Committee (SHC) is focused on the environmental sustainability aspects of Good Agricultural Practices in crops certification. The SHC will present findings from its first stage of work, which explored strategic opportunities to expand GLOBALG.A.P.'s coverage of environmental sustainability through IFA and Add-ons.

Recent findings have shown that GLOBALG.A.P. Certification has a positive impact on worker welfare as farm workers are given more training. Though workers on large certified farms earn more than those on small farms, they also show more health problems. Certification on small farms is associated with higher satisfaction of workers with their lives compared to workers on non-certified small farms.

The GRASP SHC will present the improved GRASP tools that were reviewed based on feedback received during the last 2 years of running the add-on. The GRASP Checklist will be refined and requirements for producer groups and the qualification of auditors have been reviewed.

The new version of the GLOBALG.A.P. Chain of Custody (CoC) Certification Standard is designed to ensure segregation and traceability throughout the supply chain and covers all GLOBALG.A.P. certified products (crops, livestock and aquaculture). Only through full monitoring and control of the entire supply chain can we fully reassure consumers of the integrity of GLOBALG.A.P. certified products, their certified status, and their origin. The CoC standard is based on a system that regulates proper identification of every player in the chain, input check via certification validity, accurate labeling, product segregation and traceability, and validation through mass balance.

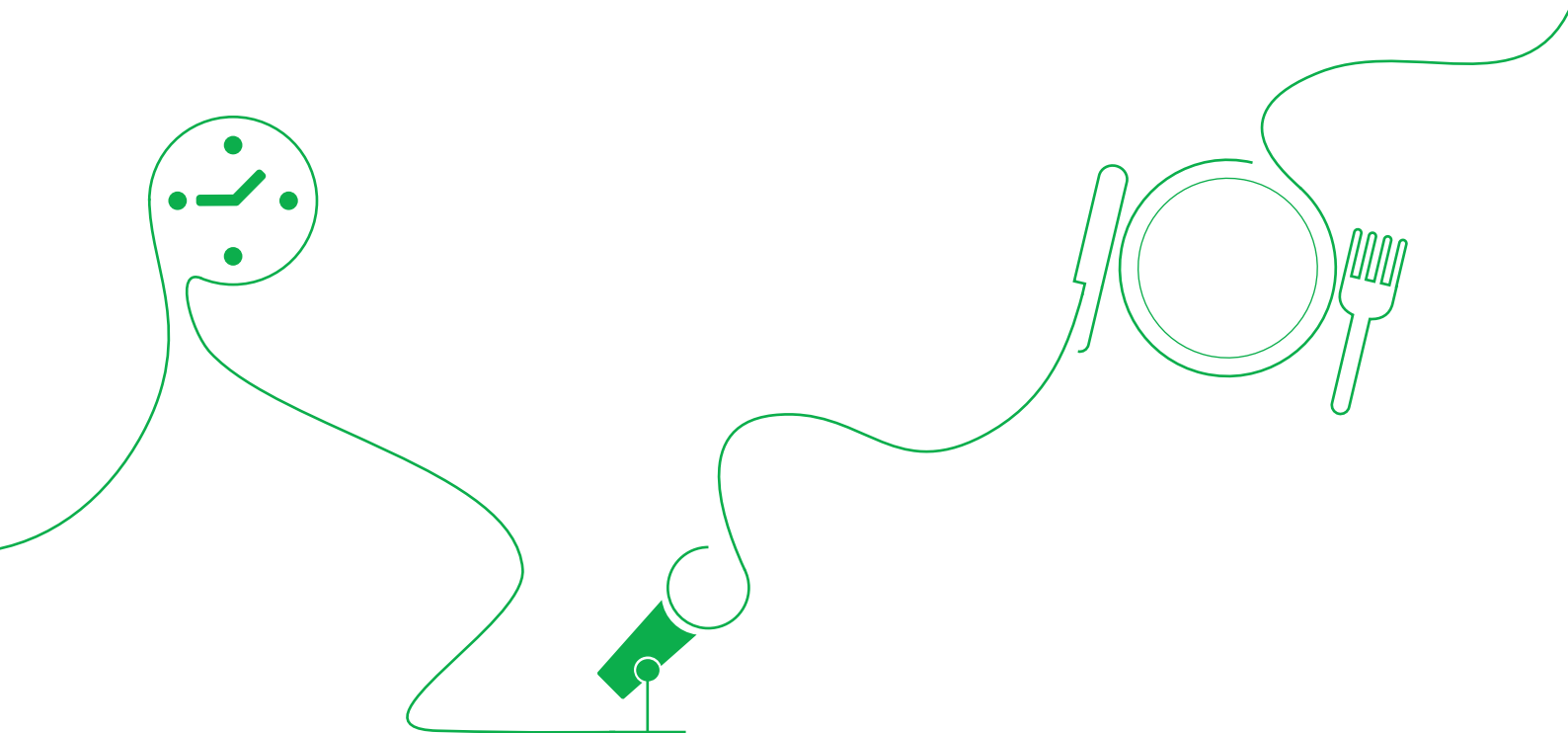
